Development of the DCoC Information Sharing Network (ISN) to meet the objectives of the Jeddah Amendment – Through the Implementation of the DCoC strategy and Roadmap for the DCoC information Sharing Strategy:	Provide technical assistance to signatory States in establishing and operationalizing multiagency National Maritime Information Sharing Centres (NMISCs), including the domestication of Regional Information Sharing SOPs and assistance with relevant equipment and systems. This will include measures for the effective integration of the RCOC and RMIFC into the DCoC Information Sharing Network (ISN), as well as support for the operationalization of ReMISC in Aden, Yemen. Strengthen the ISN to facilitate the coordination of operations at sea to combat illicit activities, including collaboration with international naval forces supporting DCoC objectives.	<ul> <li>The proposed EU Crisis Response project will provide significant support, including conducting capability assessments of up to six National Maritime Information Sharing Centres (NMISCs), as well as:</li> <li>Equipment procurement for the six NMISCs.</li> <li>Workshops and capacity-building efforts focused on operationalizing the ReMISC in Aden and linking it to regional centres, with staff funding included.</li> <li>A regional workshop to develop a framework for coordination between the NMISCs, RCOC, and RMIFC.</li> <li>Additionally, proposed EU Safe Seas for Africa Programme (SSA) will support the development and operationalization of partnerships between national maritime information sharing centres and the RMIFC and RCOC by support to NMISCs in Kenya, Tanzania, and Somalia.</li> </ul>	More funding is required to support NMISCs to attain full operational capability for a robust ISN. Secondment of LOs/ mentors for newly established NMISCs and Regional ISCs would be helpful.
