

DCoC Donor Meeting IMO Headquarters in London, United Kingdom 3rd October 2024 Remarks by the Acting Deputy HoD, SECDEFPOL.6

- In April 2024 the EU became a Friend of DCOC-JA. EU supports DCOC-JA regional maritime security architecture.
- In addition to EU MS activities (e.g. DE, DK), there are numerous EU activities in support of maritime security in the WIO, including **CRIMARIO and ATALANTA** that are represented at this meeting.
- Annually the EU support regional maritime security in the WIO with over 80 million euros.
- 15-20 vessels of EU Naval Operations or individual EU MS naval are present in the WIO every year.
- The EU considers DCOC-JA 8-Point Action Plan as a useful framework for supporting regional maritime security architecture development.
- On point 1 of the DCOC 8-point plan, concerning information sharing, the EU provides support through the Safe Seas for Africa WIO programme (former MASE) and through the Red Sea programme. In addition, teh EU provides support through the CRIMARIO project and its IORIS platform. CRIMARIO director, Martin Cauchi-Inglott, will provide an update.
- On **point 3**, Building Regional **CG capabilities**, notably in Yemen and Somalia,
 - EU supports Yemen CG capacity-building through its Red Sea Programme, implemented by UNODC
 - EU supports Somalia CG through EUCAP Somalia. EUCAP Somalia prepared a draft CG Strategy for Somalia in 2022. Somalia CG has a critical need of signalling equipment, boats (SE donated a boat).
 - EU will support capacity-building in Djibouti through a 10-million euro EPF measure including equipment.
- On point 4, regional training programme, three EU missions in the WIO: EUCAP Somalia, EUTM Somalia (focus on military, maritime component) and EUTM Mozambique. EU Naval Forces, especially ATALANTA (10-14 High Visibility training in Kenya). CRIMARIO trainings. SAFE SEAS Africa, Red Sea Programme, Port Security and Safety of Navigation Programme.
- **Point 5, meetings**: EU will attend DCOC High Level regional meeting in Dar.
- Point 6, ISPS Code: EU supports through Port Security and Safety of Navigation Programme, Red Sea programme (implementing agencies: INTERPOL, UNODC, IMO)



- In addition, **EU is considering a new project to respond to the new maritime security challenges** in the WIO, which will support the implementation of the DCOC 8-point plan. IMO would be the lead implementing partner, with CRIMARIO and possibly one more UN agency would be in supporting roles. 4 million is considered to be allocated.
- The possible new project would focus on operationalising the DCOC Info-Sharing Network, including the ReMISC centre in Aden and would support national maritime info-sharing centres in a couple of selected countries. It would benefit from the use of the IORIS platform for info-sharing, operational coordination and exercises.

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
