
















Port Security Project: Nine Beneficiary Countries










Regional Programme for Maritime Security in the Red Sea Area












Red Sea Programme: Six Beneficiary Countries





Output 2.1: Support to the domestication of international maritime legislation

- ✓ In-depth assessment of **legislative gaps** hampering the effective implementation of IMO's international maritime security instruments
- ✓ Expert support to national maritime and legislative authorities to establish mechanisms for the **domestication** of international regulations and/or the amendment of national legislation (where required)
- Support to national maritime administrations to ensure effective oversight of port security authorities:
 - ✓ National Maritime Security Strategy
 - ✓ National Maritime Risk Audit Matrix
 - ✓ National Maritime Security Committees (ToRs and membership criteria)
- ✓ Training of national inspectors / auditors to verify that ISPS Code requirements are being effectively implemented at port facilities










Output 2.2: Implementation of ISPS Code and related compliance framework by ports of participating countries

- ✓ Assisting Port Authorities Port Facilities Security Officers - in the assessment of port's compliance to the ISPS Code requirements
- ✓ In-depth **assessment/gap analysis** of existing port security measures
- ✓ Support the formulation of **Port Facility Security**Assessments and **Port Facility Security Plans**
- ✓ Support the establishment and /or capacity building of Port Security Committees (where needed)









Output 2.3: Port Security management is developed and supported in ports of participating countries

- ✓ Development and delivery of **training targeting Port**Security management/staff in relevant areas, such as:
 - ✓ Development of Threat & Risk Analysis Matrix;
 - ✓ Development of **Standard Operating Procedures** (SOPs) related to crisis response and contingency planning;
- ✓ Carrying out assessments of incident management in order to be able to respond or facilitate the intervention of any relevant agency in security related incidents in ports

Output 2.3: Port Security management is developed and supported in ports of beneficiary countries

- ✓ Carrying out assessments of emergency/evacuation plans to ensure response capabilities in case of environmental and marine pollution due to hazardous materials carried on board of vessels and/or stored in relevant dangerous goods storage area (where available)
- ✓ Develop and improve Search and Rescue mechanisms:
 - ✓ VTS Operator / Supervisor / Instructor Training














Output 2.4: Port Security Control and Compliance and Port State Control Measures are formulated and supported in their implementation

- ✓ Assistance to Maritime Authorities in ratifying relevant Memorandums of Understanding on Port State Control and in ensuring the respect of Flag State obligations
- ✓ Support in conducting Port State Control Inspections
- ✓ Capacity building on Flag State Implementation
- ✓ Training aimed at increasing the capacities, knowledge and number of Ship Surveyors and PSC Officers in the region






Result Area 3: Regional Maritime Domain Awareness and Dialogue (UNODC Lead)

Output 3.1: Regional information sharing mechanism and exchange of data on vessels, cargo, crew and passengers is developed
