I am Brigadier Mohammed Shee Shemote, Commander Kenya Navy Fleet.

On behalf of the Commander Kenya Navy, we are greatly honoured and humbled by the confidence you have placed in Kenya through our election as chair of working group 3 on Operations Cooperation and Coordination at sea. We are thankful for this role, and we assume it with a solemn commitment to serve the interests of our region and all signatory states.

This working group is special under the Djibouti Code of Conduct framework. Together we can make our seas safer, our trade routes more secure, and our maritime space more robust.

Once again, I thank you sincerely for the trust you have placed in Kenya. Let us now embark on this journey with determination and unity of purpose.
