- Paragraph 19 of Communique:
- 19. The Plenary took stock of the maritime domain situation and emerging concerns that preoccupy its members in the region. Focus was on the importance of "legal finish" as pertains drug interdiction, IUU Fishing, weapons smuggling, maritime sanctions enforcement and human smuggling; capacity building and coordination of operations at sea as well disruption of illicit financial and human networks as rising transnational maritime crimes.
