"Consequences cascade:


- Commerce: When ships divert via the Cape (point to Cape route), Egypt loses \$7 billion in Suez revenue.

  Voyages stretch by 10 days—insurance costs explode 350%.
- Security: Ransoms fund criminal empires. Trafficked Houthi weapons prolong conflicts.
- **Environment**: The *MV Sounion* near-disaster reminds us: one spill could devastate coral reefs for decades."





- ➤ Apart from piracy. RMIFC identified other ops zones against IUUF, narcotics / human smuggling, arms trafficking, etc
- Primary objective safeguard freedom of navigation




# Generation of actionable results - IUUF case study


- RMIFC information sharing with NCs of Kenya and Madagascar discovered IUUF by foreign vessels linked to Sri-Lanka and China.
- June/July 2024 Detected two Sri-Lankan owned vessels illegally fishing in northern Madagascar.
- ❖ Vessels had gone dark to avoid detection.
- Collaboration between Madagascar & Kenya identified, intercepted 2 sister vessels conducting IUU between both countries.
- Catch mostly sharks (3 tons)
- ❖ Vessels– tampered with VMS.
- ❖ Legal Finish charged with a number of violations the highest being 50,000,000 (\$400,000). Should not just end on legal finish but deterrence (beyond legal finish)
- Ops testament of building of trust, and bilateral and multilateral cooperation.



# Generation of actionable results – Illegal migration




- Data driven and intelligence led to monitor existing N/Ws and identifying new and emerging routes.
- Djibouti continues to be the preferred transit point for illegal migrants (Ethiopians, Somalis, Eritreans etc) to cross into the Red Sea to Gulf countries, Europe
- Other H.S/T n/ws linked to Anjouan + Mayotte, Nosy Be + Mayotte, East Africa + Comoros,
- ❖ RMIFC efforts to identify underlying conditions and support national initiatives (publications and articles).
- ❖ Protection of human rights prioritizing safety of migrants and ensuring medical provisions are in place (advance engagements with States through ILOs)





## OP Drifter - January 2023



#### Information received

4th January 2023 - 2x Sri Lankan fishing vessels suspected to be engaged in human trafficking left Sri Lanka intended destination of La Reunion.



#### **Concerns & Considerations**

- Loss of life at sea
- Involvement of illicit activity
- Involvement in Irregular Human Migration/Human Trafficking

#### Response

- RCOC Watch standers used Sea Vision to identify location IMULA 0532 with 72 pax
- RCOC Watch standers monitored movement and relayed information & activity
- RCOC ILO's communicated to allow for clarity and alignment on operational coordination
- UK ILO confirmed location of IMULA 0454 with 54 pax Diego Garcia



## **OP AINA** – **July 2025**

#### Information received

16th June – M/V Azfardah & Windio (AW) is reported missing at sea between Majunga and Anjouan

5th July 2025 – Request received from Madagascar to conduct a regional operation utilizing two Mauritian Dornier Aircraft (M4 & M5) for Search and Rescue operation of missing vessel AW from Madagascar.




- Issuance of necessary documentation by RCOC and Support to JRCC/MRCC Madagascar by RMIFC
- Deployment of aircraft from Mauritius NCG to Madagascar
- Three extensive days of flying covering a large search area approx 27 hour of flight time over three days for the SAR operation in Madagascar

#### Shift in operation Approach


#### Regional operation coverage

Initially supported by 07 countries involved with 20 naval assets and 5 aircrafts, regional operation coverage extends to DCOC/JA countries to the Nothern and North Eastern Of WIO (Pakistan, India, Sri Lanka, Maldives)

02 partners (EUNAVFOR & UK) with naval assets, Air assets and drones

Four main threats:

- IUU fishing
- Narcotic trafficking
- Irregular immigration
- Piracy
