Terms and Definitions

Cooperation- a shared commitment to either avoid actions that adversely affect the other and/or work separately to address shared goals and objectives and deconflict actions.

Coordination- aligning actions to achieve efficiency and <u>unity of effort</u> align resources toward a common cause or set of objectives. Participants <u>do not</u> go so far as to cede decision-making authority to each other or to some new cooperative central entity.

Collaboration- strive for <u>unity of command</u>. Often, command and control will be shared or assigned. Some aspects of organization or state sovereignty may authorize a new entity to execute centralized directives and decision-making.
