**Statement by the United Republic of Tanzania - Enhancing the Information Sharing  
Network (ISN)**

On the National Maritime Information Sharing Centre (NMISC) and Linkage with the National Maritime Security Committee (NMSC).

**Excellencies, Distinguished Delegates, Ladies and Gentlemen**

At this juncture, the United Republic of Tanzania would like to give a brief update on the current status and progress regarding its NMISC and linkage to the NMSC.

Tanzania considers that effective maritime governance relies on a strong national coordination mechanism in place. NMISC being a national platform for real-time information sharing, coordination, and response, works under the NMSC framework to align national efforts, taking into consideration the regional and international maritime security frameworks under the Djibouti Code of Conduct.

We highly value the roadmap formulation for NMISC process that has steered progressive development of our national maritime security architecture. The process has brought clarity, structure, and direction in terms of institutional linkages, capacity building, and operational readiness.

The Government of the United Republic of Tanzania is very grateful to the EU for technical and financial assistance that has played a core role in this journey. Its continued engagement has been fundamental to the advancement of NMISC development and regional cooperation.

In this regard, our country is committed to the development of SOPs with the view to ensuring efficient coordination and smooth information exchange in all matters of maritime interest. Equally, we are also working hard towards the achievement of Full Operation Capacity (FOC) for our NMISC in line with what was envisioned in the DCOC-JA.

Let me reiterate Tanzania's strong commitment to regional collaboration and its active contribution to the shared goal of safe, secure, and sustainable seas in the Western Indian Ocean and Red Sea region.
